

I've been thinking about time a lot lately. Time plays a large part of everyone's' life. I'll be 65 in a few days, and I remember many things; my parent's divorce in 1960, and when my brother lost his leg while crossing railroad tracks on a bicycle. There was my first marriage in 1968, when I was 20 year old, and the birth of my first child, a daughter, one year later. I'd had a miscarriage when I



was 19, and worried that my second pregnancy would end in the same heartache. That didn't happen, and I went on to have two more daughters before my marriage ended, as well as two more daughter's in my second marriage. The year 1985 defined the rest of my life; the years before my first born died at age 15, and the time after her death; 27 years.

During the years before November, 1985, I had times that I thought were difficult. After my daughter, Melissa's death, I found out what hard times really are. First came the time of shock: disbelief and denial, "It didn't happen because something so horrible simply could not happen." Every time I had that thought, I was thrown right back to the flooded creek where Missy died, and the funeral. There are a lot of things I don't even remember about those first weeks and months. Then came the depression. Before the death, there were many times that I thought, "Oh, I'm so sad, I'm depressed." Real depression is crushing. The world was dark. My mind played a newsreel of the accident in a loop, over and over. I couldn't escape the constant pain. Finally, I got help; someone to talk to and medication, and it helped. I noticed after a while that the world had color again, and I looked at trees, grass, flowers; just everything in wonder. Things were better, but my daughter was still gone forever. I wanted my life back. After three years, I read that we were getting a Compassionate Friends chapter in my little town, and I held onto that group like a lifeline. It was a lifeline, and I truly believe that that group of other bereaved parents saved my life.

Now, after 27 years, things are better; I've learned to cope. I know now that this

is my new life; a life without my sweet Melissa. I often wonder how life would be if she hadn't died. I wonder how different my life and the lives of my husband and children would be. I love my living children dearly, as well as my grandchildren, and I now have two great-grand kids! know that Melissa would love all of her nieces and nephews. I feel sure that she would have had children; she loved babies. We light a candle on holidays, birthdays and her death date. We all talk about her often. I've never allowed a taboo concerning her name, her life or her death. There will always be a hole in my heart where Melissa used to be. She is still my first-born and I am still her mom. She is still a big sister. I still hurt
