There may be friends and relatives who will urge you to celebrate holidays in the same way you always have; as if you haven't suffered a death of a child.

They just don't understand. You may choose to go away for holidays, if possible, or stay home instead of joining a large family group, if that is your choice. You know that you will never forget your lost child or stop thinking about him or her, although people around you may want to "help" by acting as if nothing happened and not mentioning your child's name. I like talking about my daughter and the ones closest to me know and respect this. They love and miss her too. As for the other people, the ones that act as if death is contagious if you mention it, I simply pray that they never know the pain that I, and so many others have suffered, and keep on living. It's been 29 years now since I lost my daughter. I think of Melissa every day and always will.


