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Back to school, and life in general

There are many mixed feelings about back to school. Many parents are relieved that they won't have to hear "I'm bored!" for a while. For bereaved parents, grand-parents and siblings, "back to school" is totally different.

Many families suffered miscarriages, or still births. Those who don't know might think "back to school" means nothing to these people. Mothers who went through such a loss know exactly when her child would have started school, started high school, would have gone to prom, graduated.

For those who had children in school when they died, it often begins when the stores start displaying their school supplies, and you don't need any, or you need one less than usual. Every time the school bus goes by, but doesn't stop is a time for tears to flow. Brothers and sisters who walked to school together, or had the same teachers in different grades will feel the absence of their sibling every day. For my younger daughters, teachers sometimes called them by their dead sister's name.

There are so many things to grieve about with child loss; school, birthdays, holidays, death anniversaries. And also just everyday life. The empty chair at the table. The bed no longer slept in, even the messes the lost child made are missed.

Then there are the adult children who have died. You miss the stopping by just to say hello, or the random phone call. If your adult child had children, the other parent may be great, or may be unwilling to allow visits, which is more heartbreak.

Please never think that mentioning the name of a lost child will upset the parent. We love to hear our child's name, and memories that other people have of them. It's terrible to think that our child has been forgotten. Our love lives on.
