Handling the Holidays

Merry Christmas? Happy New Year? If you've suffered the loss of a child, a grandchild or a sibling, it may feel as if you'll never say these words again, or want to hear them from others Christmas can be one of the hardest days to face when you are grieving. If you feel as if you simply cannot face other people at this time, you can tell your family and friends that you won't be attending or holding any celebrations this year. It's likely they will not understand, and we can't expect them to understand. Only people who have faced such heartache can know how you feel. At this time, it's important for you to take care of yourself first.

It really is OK for you to say no to those who wish to "act" as if everything is normal. People may tell children in the family not to mention the name of the person who has died, because it might make you sad, it could make you cry. I truly think that people may act that way because they want everything to be "normal" again for themselves; as if death were contagious. It took me several years of wishing and waiting to get my life back before I finally discovered that my "old life" wasn't coming back. How could anything be normal without my sweet Melissa? Would I really want my life to be normal without her?

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My life is different since my daughter died. How could it not be? My daughter, Melissa, was almost 16 when she died. She was beautiful, and smart. She was my first child. I tried to act as if things were not different for my three younger girls. In my mind, I hid my grief from them well; I learned many years later, that way back then, they thought I cried all the time. A child's perspective is very different than that of an adult.

People often don't seem to realize that brothers and sisters are also grieving, that their lives are as changed as their parents life has been; maybe more so. Grandparents and siblings are often overlooked when a child has died, for any reason or any age. My parents tucked away their grief and didn't talk about it. They worried about me. While I fell apart, my daughters felt as if they had lost their mother as well as their sister.

I didn't really know these things until my other daughters were grown up. I have always been eager to talk and encouraged the girls to talk about Melissa. Death is not a taboo subject for us. Since the ten year anniversary of Melissa's death, on her birthday, the girls and I try to get together. We go out to diner and take a candle to light, and Missy's baby book and photo album and just talk about her. It's a good time. We can and do share happy memories. My youngest daughter, who was born after Melissa's death. feels as if she knew her too. Every person must decide on their own about all holidays. You might want to light a candle in memory of your child on special days, or plant a tree. What ever works for you is your "new normal."
